## Akrampa's new Kitchen Building update:

Just in the past couple of weeks the last transfer of funds to complete the Akrampa Kitchen Building were sent. I give thanks again for all who gave, especially our precious benefactor who gave the vast majority of the funds for this project. She will forever be remembered as the one who made this project possible! I would also like to extend great thanks to Bethesda on the Bay Lutheran Church for their most recent donation which was sent in part to finish the kitchen, and the rest will be sent over time to help with the cost of the breakfast program.

I commissioned plaques to hang on the outside of the building to thank the wonderful individuals and churches that helped to make this project a reality. You cannot know what this means to both the people of Akrampa and also the students of the entire district. Preparations for the **Dedication and Commissioning of the Akrampa Kitchen** have been underway, and there is feeling of joy in the air. During this time I have been working with the teachers to be sure that I am able to purchase everything they will need for the kitchen. This will include all new appliances, a new stove, all kitchen items, and new furniture will be made. The excitement for not just the actual new Kitchen Building, but also the celebration to dedicate it, is spreading throughout the village.

The Dedication of the new building is now set for the date that will coincide with the return of all the children to school. Soon the breakfast meals for the students will be cooked under very hygienic conditions in our new Kitchen Building, instead of outside under the trees as it has been since 2008 when our breakfast program started. What a blessing! We thank you for the years of faithful giving that has allowed us to feed the children for so many years. And now a brand new building which will improve the health conditions so much more. 2020 ... what a perfect year to improve hygienic conditions surrounding the village and the children!! God's timing really is perfect!

Another huge benefit of the new Kitchen (beside the breakfast meal) is that the students who are taking the Home Arts courses will also have their actual classroom and a fully functioning kitchen ready for use, all in the same building. Currently, the Government's plan is that all the students will be returning to school in January. The Government is also helping to provide the school with adequate resources for the strict adherence of COVID-19 protocols as I detailed in my November article. It's important to get the students back into actual school, as <u>none</u> of our Akrampa children have any access to 'virtual learning'.

Ghanaians (as a nation) have gone to the polls, December 7, and the Electoral Commission has declared the incumbent, Nana Akufo Addo, as president-elect to be sworn in on January 7, 2021. The parliament will also be sworn in on the same day. There are protests from the main opposition party that the elections were rigged in favor of the incumbent, but all the other parties that contested the elections have accepted the results and their leadership have called to congratulate the president-elect.

We pray that the Lord will be with us so we go through the yuletide with the greatest expectation of a prosperous New Year.
