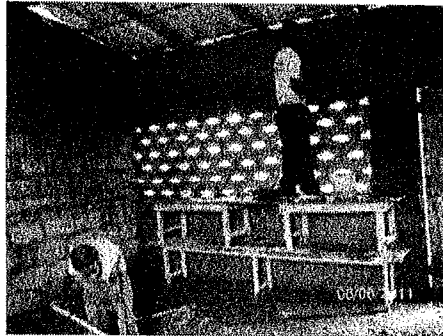

Akrampa Endowment Project

We are taking a break in the series "A Day in the Life," to let you know what is currently going on in Akrampa, Ghana. We will return to Lucy's story soon.

In early June work resumed on rehabilitating the very first set of the school classrooms, thanks to the Endowment Grant from First Lutheran. The inside plastering of the walls and floor had not been done until now.



The students and teachers are assisting in the work. The children are fetching the water that is used to mix the plaster. This involvement is to train the children in being responsible, and helping to shape their own future.



The water is fetched from the hole that gathers water during the rainy season, so as to avoid paying for good water from the pipe. This is teaching the villagers to conserve water, and to save themselves from higher bills.

Thank you friends, for this Endowment Grant, this gift, which will now bring the older classrooms up to standard, like the newer ones. This gift will make the walls and floor of the school cleaner, more conducive to learning, and more attractive to both students and teachers.
