Dear Friends,

As the end of November draws near we are approaching the American holiday of Thanksgiving. Julie and I have had the pleasure of spending a few Thanksgiving holidays in Ohio with our friends throughout the years. While this is obviously <u>not</u> a holiday we celebrate in Ghana, I have come to love the traditions of it while here. This year, I thought that I would use my November article to **give thanks** for some of the **blessings** that have occurred during our 2024 trip to Ohio.

As most of you know, the main purpose of our trip to Ohio, this year, was to help with my medical care. And we were so grateful to Mercy Health (Lorain) for facilitating the Laminectomy Surgery on my lower back, on Aug. 29th. And as always, so thankful to **Pastor Jimmy** for hosting us in his home for almost 5 months.

For many years now, my eyes have been monitored by both American and Ghanaian doctors for slowly progressing cataracts in both of my eyes. The cataracts were at first small and not impacting my vision or daily life. But as many of you may have personally experienced, once the cataracts reach a certain point, they can be very detrimental to even basic vision. While in Ohio, Julie and I have both been blessed to receive eye care from Dr. Eric Stocker, O.D. in Amherst. During my check-up with Dr Stocker a couple months ago, he noted that my cataracts had reached a point where surgery to correct them was very necessary.

There were many challenges ahead of us in the way of hoping, praying, planning and trying to look for a way for me to be able to have cataract eye surgery while still in Ohio, and on such a short time frame. There were many people that helped us, talked with us, made calls for us, networked for us, and overall lent a hand in helping direct our planstoo many to name ...you all know who you are ... Thank you!!

Through the immense help of one of my friends and business contacts from home, in Ghana - and through Dr Stocker - we were able to arrange for my cataract surgery to happen in early November.

On November 13, 2024, Dr. William F. Wiley M.D., of Avon Ohio, preformed the cataract surgery on both of my eyes, on the same day. Although most people have one eye done at a time, we opted to have both of my eyes done at the same time because of the literal timeframe of Julie and I flying home the second week of December. The doctors agreed that doing both eyes at the same time would give me the best chance of healing correctly before going home. Dr Wiley did a wonderful job on my surgery and Dr Stocker has been taking care of my post-op check-ups. Thank you to both doctors for amazing care!

I'd like to thank our longtime friend, and Chair of the Ghana Committee, Kristen Anthony, for her ongoing help with my articles. As many of you know my vision has been only slowly coming back post-cataract surgery; but reading, writing, & typing have been exceptionally difficult while recovering and healing from this surgery. Kristen and I have worked together since the very beginning on my monthly articles. She is my Editor, and we brainstorm ideas together in an effort to try to bring the most interesting topics and stories to you each month. For my article this month, she is helping me more than ever, by taking care of the physical typing, since seeing the screen & keyboard is still difficult during my healing process.

During our 2024 stay in Ohio, <u>Julie and I have been very blessed</u> by both old and new friends. We always look forward to spending time with the people that we love, and we look forward to making new connections.

We'd like to welcome Pastor Shari Ayers as the new Lead Pastor of First Lutheran Church. Julie and I were grateful to be in Ohio when she started at FLC and to be able to meet her in person immediately. The Ghana Committee and I are looking forward to working with Pastor Shari to continue with the excellent work of the mission and for her help and partnership to push it forward into the future.

Pastor Jimmy and I made some new friends and saw some old friends when we went to **Trinity Lutheran Church** in Vermilion recently. Pastor Jimmy was guest preaching there, and they invited me to come along. I was happy to be part of the service on a Sunday morning.
